How do I learn to pray?

First, realize that we are not born knowing how to pray; we need to ask God to teach us. Then, take a look at Mark 1:35— Jesus gets up really early in the morning and goes into solitude to pray. This shows us that there is wisdom in planning a *time* and *place* to pray.

If you are serious about working out, you'll have a specific gym, a workout partner, a time to hit the weights, and a proper diet. So, where is your spiritual gym? Obviously, regular attendance at Mass is vitally important. There can be no higher expression of prayer offered than that of the Mass. When we are not at church, it is always a good idea to try and find a place at home or in your room that you can set aside for prayer. Maybe you could place a standing crucifix, a candle, or a picture of the Sacred Heart of Jesus there.

Who is your spiritual workout partner? Do you have a good priest that you go to for confession? Having a priest with whom you feel comfortable and can share honestly can be a huge benefit for you.

Do you have a set time that you pray? If you are a morning person, you may want to get up ten minutes earlier for prayer. If you are more of a night person, then pray after dinner. But be careful about pushing prayer time to right before you go to bed. Night prayers are great, but if you want some quality time with God, make sure you do it at a time when you are fully alert. Whatever time you choose be consistent!

When starting your prayer, ask the Holy Spirit to come and bless your prayer time. Then, pause to become aware of God's presence: 1) all around you; 2) in the Eucharist during Mass and in the tabernacle; 3) in your soul; and 4) in heaven, watching you pray. This brief recollection may help you to focus on the reality of how near He is to you. Sometimes we drift off, because we don't realise how closely God listens to our every word.

As we've mentioned, the key to getting in good 'prayer shape' is consistency. Set aside ten minutes at the beginning of the day or at night and watch how your spiritual life deepens.

Praying one Our Father with attention, devotion, and love is worth more than praying a hundred of them in a distracted and rushed way. In the words of St Teresa of Avila, prayer is "to be alone with Him who we know loves us".
