4TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (A)

GOSPEL REFLECTION

Parents want what is best for their children and God wants what is best for us. What is best for us? That even here now we already enjoy something of the peace of heaven. In heaven we will be close to God and if we are to enjoy something of the peace of heaven here now, we can do so only by being close to God. Moses went up Mount Sinai and came down with the Ten Commandments to help us on the journey to God. In Galilee, Jesus went up the mountain and taught the Beatitudes to reveal how can enjoy the peace of heaven by knowing the heart of God (Matt 5:1-12). In the Beatitudes, Jesus is praising certain values and attitudes and telling us if you have these values and attitudes you will be close to God and you will be blessed. If we want to know what the heart of God is like, we need look no further than the Beatitudes. The Beatitudes invite us to imitate the heart of God. Some Church Fathers tell us that God became man in Christ so that we would become more like God. The Beatitudes teach us how to become more like God, how to reflect the goodness and beauty and truth in the heart of God, in the Sacred Heart of Jesus. It is true that the qualities and virtues praised in the Beatitudes are in some ways contrary to what is exalted and practiced in the world. That only tells us how far the world is from the heart of God because in the beatitudes we see the heart of God.

Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. I once heard this beatitude translated as "blessed are those who have to rely on God for every breath they take." This beatitude is not praising economic poverty but poverty in spirit which is being dependent on God for everything. In this beatitude, instead of we praising God, God is praising those who rely totally on him and promises a reward: "the kingdom of heaven is theirs." In the other beatitudes the reward is in the future— "they will be comforted...they will inherit the land...they will be satisfied..."—but in this first beatitude the reward is now, "the kingdom of heaven is theirs." This is surely because those who are poor in spirit are clinging to God and are so totally united with God that even now they are experiencing something of the peace of heaven.
