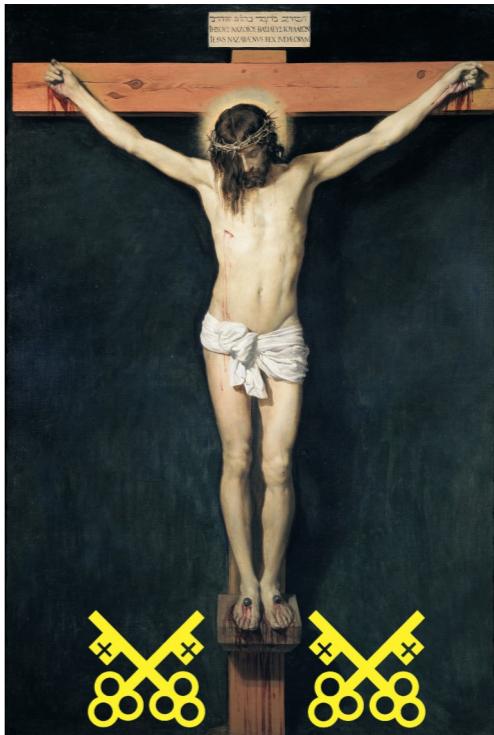

24th Sunday in Ordinary Time (B)



This week's illustration is *Christ Crucified* (1632) by Diego Velázquez (1599-1660), upon which I have superimposed the keys of St. Peter.

There can be no keys unless first there is the cross.

And so St. Peter makes his declaration of faith, a declaration which will see him entrusted with the keys of the kingdom with the power to bind and loose the sins of men and women (Matthew 16: 19). Yet at the very moment when Peter makes his declaration, he fails to realise the true nature of Christ's destiny. "I offered my back to those who struck me, my cheeks to those who tore at my beard; I did not cover my face against insult and spittle." (Isaiah 50: 6) As disciples of Jesus Christ we have to take up our crosses—whatever they may be—so we can be truly like the Son of Man, "rejected by the elders and the chief priests and the scribes, [and who was] put to death." (Mark 8: 31). St. Peter, the first pope, the rock on whom Christ builds his Church (Matthew 16: 18), finds this out during the course of his life: he will be crucified, but, unlike his beloved Lord and Master, he will be crucified upside down.

THE SIGN OF PEACE

During the Covid outbreak exchanging the Sign of Peace was temporarily suspended; this suspension has continued at Our Lady and St. Peter's. Please feel free during the celebration of the Mass to exchange a Sign of Peace with your neighbours; this could take the form either of a handshake or of a bow. This acknowledgement of our neighbour is so important for we are all pilgrims journeying towards the kingdom of our Father. We are all equal, needing the support of our fellow disciples of the Resurrected Lord.

"The Rite of Peace

There follows the Rite of Peace, by which the Church entreats peace and unity for herself and for the whole human family, and the faithful express to each other their ecclesial communion and mutual charity before communicating in the Sacrament.

As for the actual sign of peace to be given, the manner is to be established by the Conferences of Bishops in accordance with the culture and customs of the peoples. However, it is appropriate that each person, in a sober manner, offer the sign of peace only to those who are nearest."
