

The disciples cling to the exciting prospect that they will inherit leading roles in God's kingdom: hence their argument about who is the greatest. Nothing could be more opposed to Jesus' teaching. "Do you understand what I have done to you? You call me Teacher and Lord, and you are right, for so I am. If I then, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet." (John 13:12-14) Telling the disciples that those who want to lead must be the servant of all, Jesus dramatizes his teaching by placing a little child in front of them. In the ancient world children had no social status or value whatsoever; until adulthood they were nobodies. For someone outside the family to 'welcome' a child would be to turn prevailing values upside down, putting aside all ideas of self-importance and adult status to simply meet the child as an equal. It is hard to exaggerate the significance of this gesture of identification with a child. Jesus' gesture shows more powerfully than any words could express the value of each and every human life in the sight of God, no matter how small, how insignificant in the eyes of the world, both then and now.

### THE SIGN OF PEACE

This acknowledgement of our neighbour is so important for we are all pilgrims journeying towards the kingdom of our Father. We are all equal, needing the support of our fellow disciples of the Resurrected Lord.

"The Rite of Peace

There follows the Rite of Peace, by which the Church entreats peace and unity for herself and for the whole human family, and the faithful express to each other their ecclesial communion and mutual charity before communicating in the Sacrament.

As for the actual sign of peace to be given, the manner is to be established by the Conferences of Bishops in accordance with the culture and customs of the peoples. However, it is appropriate that each person, in a sober manner, offer the sign of peace only to those who are nearest."



On 1 December 2024 (the First Sunday of Advent) a new English version of the Lectionary for Mass comes into force in England, Wales and Scotland. The Catholic Truth Society have produced a leaflet, *The New Lectionary Explained*, which gives a brief introduction about this. Free copies of the leaflet are available in the CTS rack on the table near the entrance to the church.

As a result of these changes, *The Jerusalem Mass Sheet* we currently use will be replaced by *The Catholic Mass Sheet*. This will contain all the readings as well as all the responses but will not include the Prefaces or the Eucharistic Prayer. This change will give greater freedom in the choice of Prefaces and of the Eucharistic Prayers.
