Christ Healing the Deaf and Dumb Man
Domenico Maggiotto (1713-1794)

The healing of the man who is deaf and suffering from an impediment in his speech has a very physical nature: Jesus puts his fingers in the man's ears and touches his tongue with spittle. This teaches us two things. First, our Lord is not afraid of our physical nature, which is wonderfully illustrated in this painting by Maggiotto. On Christmas day we hear of how "the Word became flesh and dwelt among us" (John 1:14). God is not afraid of us, loving us despite our sins and our failings. He came to heal us, to restore us. This leads us to the second matter about our Lord's healing of the deaf and dumb man. Through word and touch, Jesus brings him into the hearing and speaking world of personal communication. In this experience the man represents all believers. Apart from the grace of God we are 'deaf' to the Word of life spoken to us by the Creator. By opening our ears Jesus gives us the capacity to hear his life-giving Word, which he then speaks to us in the Scriptures proclaimed by the church: "The eyes of the blind shall be opened, the ears of the deaf unsealed, then the lame shall leap like a deer and the tongues of the dumb sing for joy" (Isaiah 35: 5-6) In this way Jesus enables us to join in the chorus of the community of faith: "He has done all things well."
