19TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (C)



This week’s Newsletter illustration shows beehive houses in the city of Harran in southern Turkey. Abraham was born in Ur of the Chaldeans (Genesis 11: 27-30) but with his father Terah, his wife Sarah, and other relatives he left Ur for Haran (Genesis 11: 31). It was here that Abraham heard the call of God to journey to Canaan, a place God promised Abraham would one day belong to his descendants (Genesis 12: 1-9). This is the background of this Sunday’s second reading from the Letter to the Hebrews. By faith in God, Abraham became a wanderer over the face of the earth. The author of this letter writes that people like Abraham “recognise...they were only strangers and nomads on earth. People who use such terms about themselves make it quite plain that they are in search of their real homeland.” (Hebrews 11:13-14) On a purely personal note, now that most of my family have died, I am beginning to understand the words of the author of the letter to the Hebrews. I long to see my dead relatives once more; only Christ can make this happen. And above and beyond seeing my relatives, there is the hope given to all Christians at their baptism that one day we shall see God himself and be like him (I John 3: 2). My longing to see my deceased relatives is not a cue for violins but a cue for the celebratory music of Marc-Antoine Charpentier’s *Te Deum*, especially the prelude to the *Te Deum*, *Marche en rondeau*.

The Vatican announced that Pope Leo XIV will declare St John Henry Newman a Doctor of the Catholic Church.

Responding to the news, Archbishop John Wilson said:

“The announcement that St John Henry Newman will become a Doctor of the Catholic Church will fill the hearts of English Catholics with so much joy. It will also be welcomed by Catholics around the world for whom St John Henry is an inspiring theologian and apologist for the Catholic faith.

“For all his enormous intellect and learning, St John Henry above all lived the humility of a disciple, with a passion for truth. His life shines as an example of what it means to be a true follower of Christ.

If we want to grow in holiness, if we are passionate to find the truth and walk in His ways, we first need to humble ourselves before the Lord Jesus, just as St John Henry did. His towering intellect brought him to seek Christ ‘heart to heart.’ May this soon to be new Doctor of the Church teach us to do the same.”

A Doctor of the Church is a man or woman of great holiness and learning whose teaching and wisdom not only resonated with their own contemporaries, but still illuminates, instructs and inspires today.
