Today we remember with gratitude all those who gave their lives in the First and Second World Wars, as well as in subsequent conflicts, so we can be free today. Without their bravery, fortitude and strength we would not enjoy many of the rights and privileges we take for granted. Yet for those who have lost loved ones through battle such words as “they gave their lives so that others may be free” can seem empty and hollow. Yes, they gave their lives so that others are free, but what about them, what hope is there for them?

This year we not only honour the war dead on Remembrance Sunday but also celebrate the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica, the mother Church of all churches throughout the world. Today’s readings afford us hope, for ourselves and for those who have died before us. In the Gospel we hear of the Resurrection of our Lord. He is sneered at for saying, “Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up.” But as the writer of the Gospel points out, “he was speaking about the temple that was his body.” By dying on the Cross and rising from the dead, Jesus shows us the pattern of human life: we are born; we live our lives here on earth; yes, we die; but through our baptism we share in Christ’s death on the Cross, living our lives in the hope of sharing in his Resurrection. As we remember those who gave their lives for us, let us pray for those who have gone before us, entrusting them to God’s mercy and forgiveness so they may come to a place of refreshment, light and peace.
