"The Lord's mercies are not over,
his deeds of faithful love not exhausted;
every morning they are renewed:
great is your faithfulness!
'The LORD is all I have,' says my soul,
'and so I put my hope in him.'"

(Lamentations 3: 22-24)

Browsing through the Bible ("surprise, surprise" [as our Cilla would have said], I do this!!), I came across this short verse from Lamentations, five poems lamenting the destruction of Jerusalem in 586 BC. Despite all that has occurred, the author places his hope and trust in God. On this Easter Sunday our world is no different to what it was on the Sundays before the start of Lent. Thus has it always been. Today, though, we celebrate the Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. Whatever happens in this world, God has overcome the structures and institutions of sin and death. Passing years may have dulled us to the wonder of the Resurrection, but we need to look at these events through the eyes of the first Christians. In his letters, Saint Paul told of Jesus Christ, a Jesus who is a living presence, not simply a name from the recent past. A transforming, healing, disturbing, and challenging presence. A presence that at one level was the kind of thing that would be associated with divine power and on another level seemed personal—human, in fact. In the days of our ancestors in the faith, people turned away from the idols they had served, discovering in Jesus a God who was alive, who did things, who changed people's lives from the inside out. As the certainties of our world fast disappear, perhaps this is our opportunity to turn away from our idols to discover the God who is alive, changing people's lives from the inside out.
