6TH SUNDAY OF EASTER (A)



The illustration is from a late fifteenth-century French Book of Hours (c.1475). The Holy Trinity is presented in the pose of ‘The Mercy Seat’: God the Father on the throne holds the crucified Christ as the Man of Sorrows (Isaiah 52: 13—53: 12) with the Holy Spirit represented as a dove between them (John 14: 15-17).

In today’s holy Gospel according to John we are once again with the disciples listening to Jesus’ teaching during the Last Supper. The theme of love is uppermost. Loving Jesus means keeping his commandments. Here ‘commandment’ has a specific sense related to faith and love. The basic requirement is to believe in Jesus as the revelation of the Father and to love our neighbour as we love ourselves. If love prevails, when Jesus is absent the disciples will not lack something that his presence has so far provided: guidance, comfort, and strength in the face of the hostility surrounding them. This is because he will ask the Father to give them “another Helper” who will remain with them for ever (John 14: 16). This Helper will be their advocate. An advocate is someone you would want to stand beside you when you are in a difficult situation—under accusation, at a loss for what to say, needing defence. This description of the Holy Spirit implies that Jesus has functioned as an advocate for the disciples up till now. In the future situation of his absence, the Holy Spirit will take over this role. As Jesus has been on trial before the world throughout his ministry, so the disciples will be on trial as they take up the mission in his name. And just as this was true for the disciples in the early days of the Church, so also is it true for us in 2026. Through the sacraments of baptism and confirmation we have received the gifts and grace of the Holy Spirit. He lives in us, enabling us to know of the intimate relationship between the Father and the Son (John 14: 20), the Father and the Son who long to share their life with us in communion with the Holy Spirit (John 14: 19).
