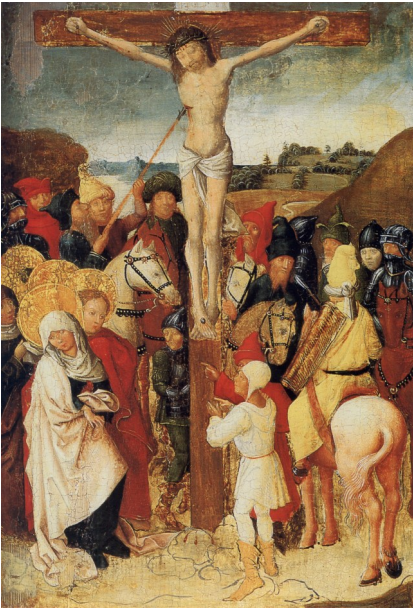

The greatest privilege afforded to priests is the right to celebrate the Mass; the greatest privilege for all Catholics is the invitation by Christ to participate in the Eucharist. “The Eucharist is ‘the source and summit of the Christian life.’ The other sacraments...are bound up with the Eucharist and are oriented towards it. For in the blessed Eucharist is contained the whole spiritual good of the Church, namely Christ himself, our Pasch.” (*Catechism of the Catholic Church* 1324)

What has always struck me during the celebration of the Mass is the fragility of the way in which Christ is present. Under the humble appearance of bread and wine, our Lord gives himself to us completely: body, soul and divinity. We are invited to share totally in the person of Jesus Christ so that we may one day be like him. “I am the food of the fully grown; grow and you will feed on me. And you will not change me into you like the food your flesh eats, but you will be changed into me.” (St. Augustine of Hippo, *Confessions* 7: X[16]). Celebrating the great Solemnity of Corpus Christi this Sunday, let us always remember our Lord comes to us gently, knowing who we are with all our frailties and weaknesses (Matthew 26: 41). During our earthly life he feeds us with himself to prepare us for the time when we will see him as he is: “Beloved, we are God’s children now; what we will be has not yet been revealed. What we do know is this: when he is revealed, we will be like him, for we shall see him as he is.” (I John 3: 2)

MAGNIFICA HUMANITAS

Pope Leo XIV has just written his first Encyclical, *Magnifica Humanitas*, regarding the safeguarding of the human person in the time of artificial intelligence. The opening paragraph of the Encyclical states:

“Humanity, created by God in all its grandeur, is today facing a pivotal choice: either to construct a new Tower of Babel or to build the city in which God and humanity dwell together. Each generation inherits the task of shaping its own era, of guiding history to become a place where the dignity of every person is safeguarded, justice is promoted and fraternity is made possible. Yet every era also runs the risk of creating an inhumane and more unjust world. Whenever humanity is in danger of marring its true identity, we Christians lift our eyes to the Incarnate God, knowing that it is “only in the mystery of the Word made flesh that the mystery of humanity truly becomes clear.” [Gaudium et Spes 22] In Jesus Christ, this humanity in its grandeur becomes the Way, the Truth and the Life, opening the path for each of us to grow toward fullness.”
