**TWELFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (A)**



Tree Sparrows

In the Sunday Gospel we hear our Lord reassuring his disciples “Fear not, therefore; you are of more value than many sparrows.” (Matthew 10: 31) The disciples experienced fear; they worried about what would happen to them in the future: we only need to think of Peter warming himself before a charcoal fire in the courtyard of the high priest denying he knew Jesus (John 18: 15-18, 25-27). Our Lord himself knew fear in the Garden of Gethsemane: “He took with him Peter and James and John, and began to be distressed and agitated. And he said to them, ‘I am deeply grieved, even to death...’” (Mark 14: 32-34) It can be said that to fear is to be human: for ourselves, for our loved ones, of what the future may hold. As human beings we cannot not be afraid. And yet it is also true that we are indeed “of more value than many sparrows.” These two things of being afraid and yet knowing the love of God for us are held in tension, forming a paradox we cannot solve by human reason alone. Only the cross of Christ resolves this paradox, not by answering it but by showing us that God in Jesus Christ entered into all areas of our lives, even the most fearful and terrible ones, the ones that make us fearful even to death. The wide open arms of our crucified Saviour on the cross reveal to humanity that no one is excluded from God’s love and no aspect of our individual lives is dismissed by God.
