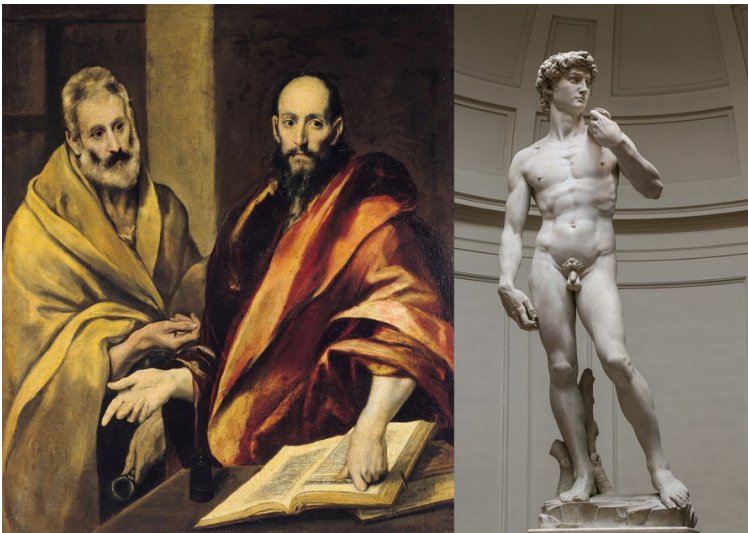

SAINT PETER AND SAINT PAUL



Saint Peter and Saint Paul (1587-1592) El Greco (1541-1614)
David (1501-1504) Michelangelo (1475-1564)

Carrara marble has been in use since the time of Ancient Rome. From a single block of this marble Michelangelo carved his famous statue of David. The work that went into creating this statue was done over a period of three years. For Michelangelo it was truly a labour of love, taking an unshaped block of marble and creating out of it something that will stand for all time as an icon of beauty and artistic perfection.

And is this not what we see with St. Peter and St. Paul? Two very different men; two very unlikely people to lead the early Church: yet here we are honouring them as the princes of the Apostles. St. Peter and St. Paul, fashioned by the grace of God in their lives, were the heralds of Christ's resurrection in their own day and help us to be true to the faith in our time.

Pressing forward as messengers of the Gospel, leaning on Christ, accepting their weaknesses, repenting of their sins, led Peter and Paul to the highest form of faith: the will to suffer for the sake of Christ. When Peter and Paul were martyred in Rome they came to know reality as it is. "[The Lord] said to me, 'My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness.'...Therefore I am content with weaknesses, insults, hardships, persecutions, and calamities for the sake of Christ; for whenever I am weak, then I am strong." (II Corinthians 12: 9-10)

At their martyrdoms they were totally configured to Christ; they knew what it meant to be a Christian; to be broken like a rock in a quarry.
