The rostra in the Roman Forum from where the leading citizens of Rome delivered speeches

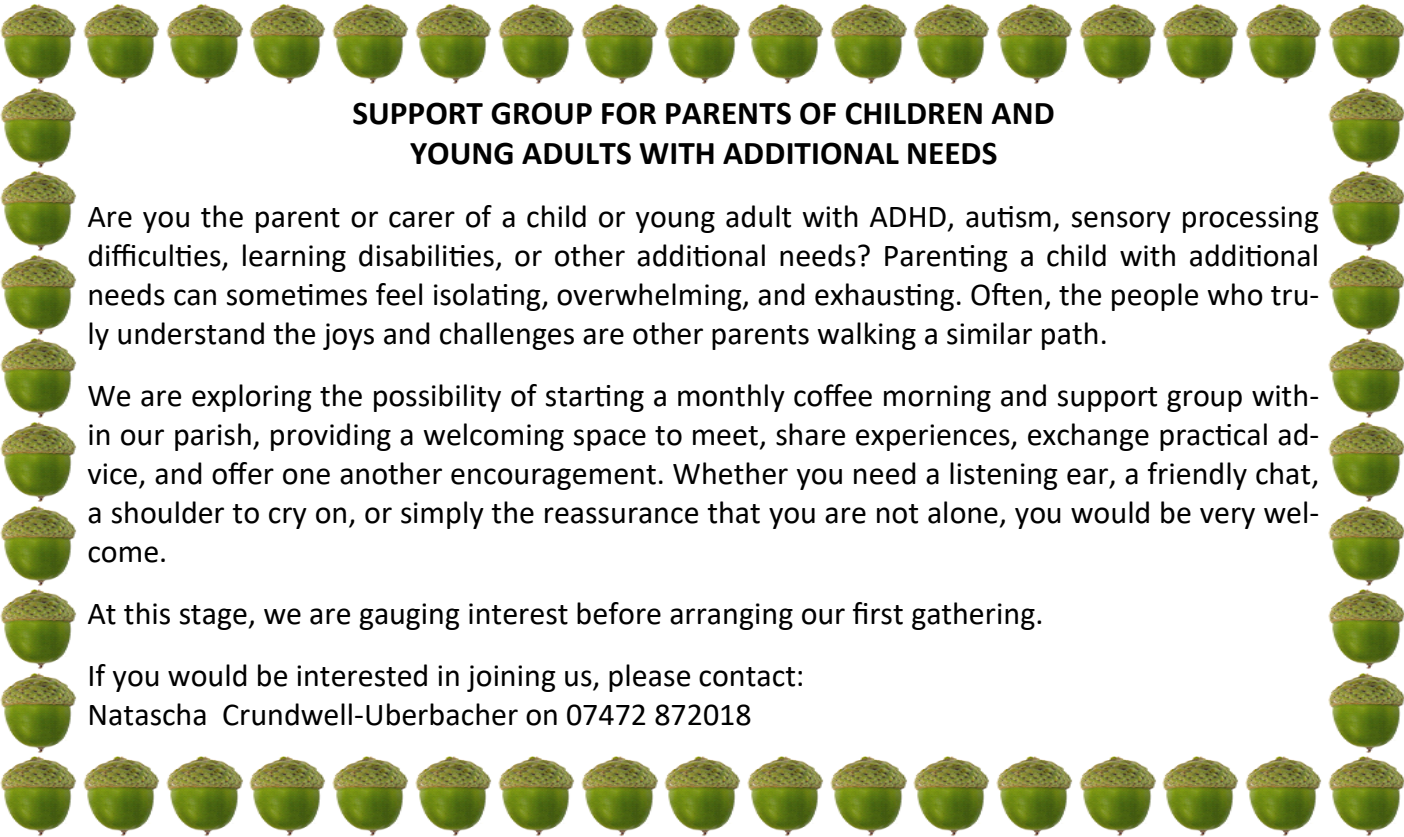
In St. Paul’s letter to the Romans, we are reminded of the division between the things of this world and the life we are called to live. “You are not in the flesh but in the Spirit, if in fact the Spirit of God dwells in you.” (Romans 8: 9) These words are wonderful to listen to during the celebration of Mass; but how much of our lives is lived in accordance with them?

All of us want to be true disciples of the Lord. Yet again and again the way we want to live is compromised by the way we actually live. Is there any way out of this dilemma? Well, yes there is: the way out is the person of Christ. The one who says to us, “Come to me, all you who labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest.” (Matthew 11: 28)

St. Paul was well aware of this dilemma in his own life. Earlier on in the letter to the Romans he wrote, “So I find it to be a law that when I want to do what is good, evil lies close at hand. For I delight in the law of God in my inmost self, but I see in my members another law at war with the law of my mind, making me captive to the law of sin that dwells in my members. Wretched man that I am! Who will rescue me from this body of death? Thanks be to God through Jesus Christ our Lord!” (Romans 7: 21-25) St. Paul’s heartfelt cry is the cry of all of us as we try to follow Jesus Christ. Let us always remember that Jesus never deserts us but is close to us in all our struggles.
