FIFTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (A)

The Parable of the Sower is so familiar that we can misunderstand its application in our own lives. For instance, when we hear of the different grounds on which the seed falls, do we automatically think of the different people whom we meet during the course of our lives? Despite our Lord's injunction not to indulge in hypocritical, self-righteous criticism—"Do not judge, so that you may not be judged." (Matthew 7: 1)—it is all too easy for us to think of the various types of ground on to which the seed falls to refer to individual types of men and women. Perhaps what we should be doing is to look at the various aspects of our own lives, for it is true we refuse to listen to the Gospel in all the areas of our lives. We welcome with enthusiasm the Good News of our Lord in certain areas: this is the good soil which allows the seed to produce grain. Yet when we realise that in other parts of our lives we place barriers to the word of God, then these we have to understand are the paths of our lives, the rocky grounds, the soil where the thorns have come up to choke the seeds. It is not easy for us to accept the full reality of the Gospel, to surrender what we think is important, what we think makes us who we are, to the hands of God. This will often involve us dying to our old self so we can be remade anew. "...unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just a single grain; but if it dies, it bears much fruit." (John 12: 24) We are indeed the clay in the hands of the potter who is God, refashioning us to be "another vessel, as seemed good to him." (cf. Jeremiah 18: 1-11)
